Transportation | Bussing









- Bussing is available for Kindergarten students one way
- Bussing is available both ways for Grade 1 students
- My First Ride Program A free school bus safety program for new riders and parents.
- K-5 yellow bus transportation provided following CBE congregated stop guidelines for alternative programs
 - parents pay an annual fee for CBE yellow bus service
- Congregated stops are reviewed annually and informed by pre-registration for transportation, online through MyCBE/PowerSchool
- Congregated stops may not be within walking distance and alternate arrangements may be required to access the congregated stop








- Students entering kindergarten or Grade 1 can register
- Previous French experience is not required and parents do not need to know the language
- In the case of an alternate entry point, parents will reach out to the school directly to arrange an appointment for language assessment for suitable placement.
- Registration opens January 13, 2025

Blue Months - Child must be registered in Grade One.

Green Months - Child should be registered in Kindergarten

Children born between September- December 2019 may register in Kindergarten or Grade One. We would strongly encourage children born during this time be registered in kindergarten unless the child has prior ECS programming.

Yellow Months - Child is eligible to start Kindergarten in 2025-26 OR 2026-27

Red Months- Cannot register as this child is too young (born after December 31, 2020 cutoff).

Lottery Process

- Where a program is oversubscribed the lottery process will be employed
- Registrations are categorized using 3 priorities:
 - Priority 1 siblings in walk zone
 - Priority 2 walk zone, no siblings or outside walk zone with sibling
 - Priority 3 designated attendance area
- Notification of acceptance via letter or email by 10 business days after the lottery (February 22, 2025)











Lottery Schools | Timeline for Registration

- Registration will begin in January for the 2025-26 school year (January 13, 2025)
- The registration will be closed at noon on the Tuesday before Teachers' Convention (February 11, 2025)
- Lottery drawn is on Wednesday before Teachers' Convention (February 12, 2025)
- Results of the lottery draw sent within 10 business days of the draw (February 22, 2025)
- Parents must accept/decline within 10 business days from the date of the acceptance letter
- On your application, you can indicate your preference for morning or afternoon class. Placement in morning and afternoon classes will be done by draw.


